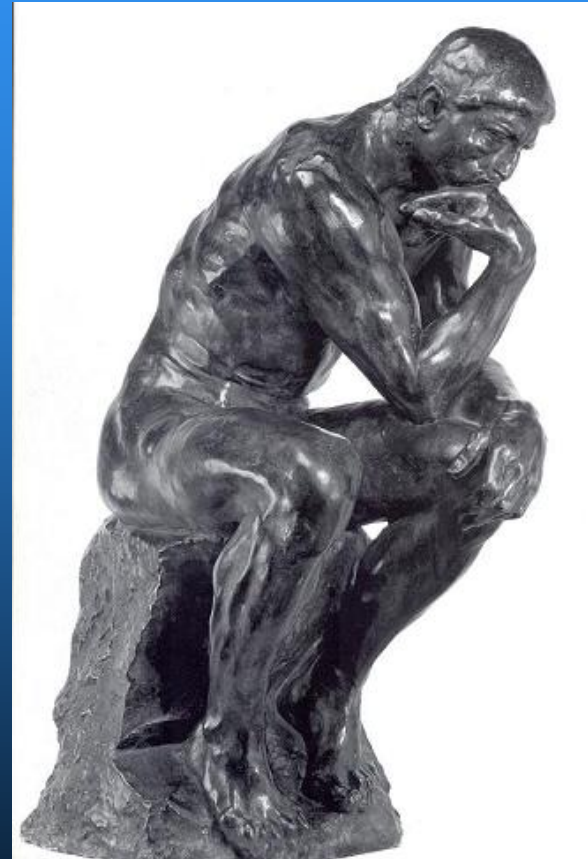

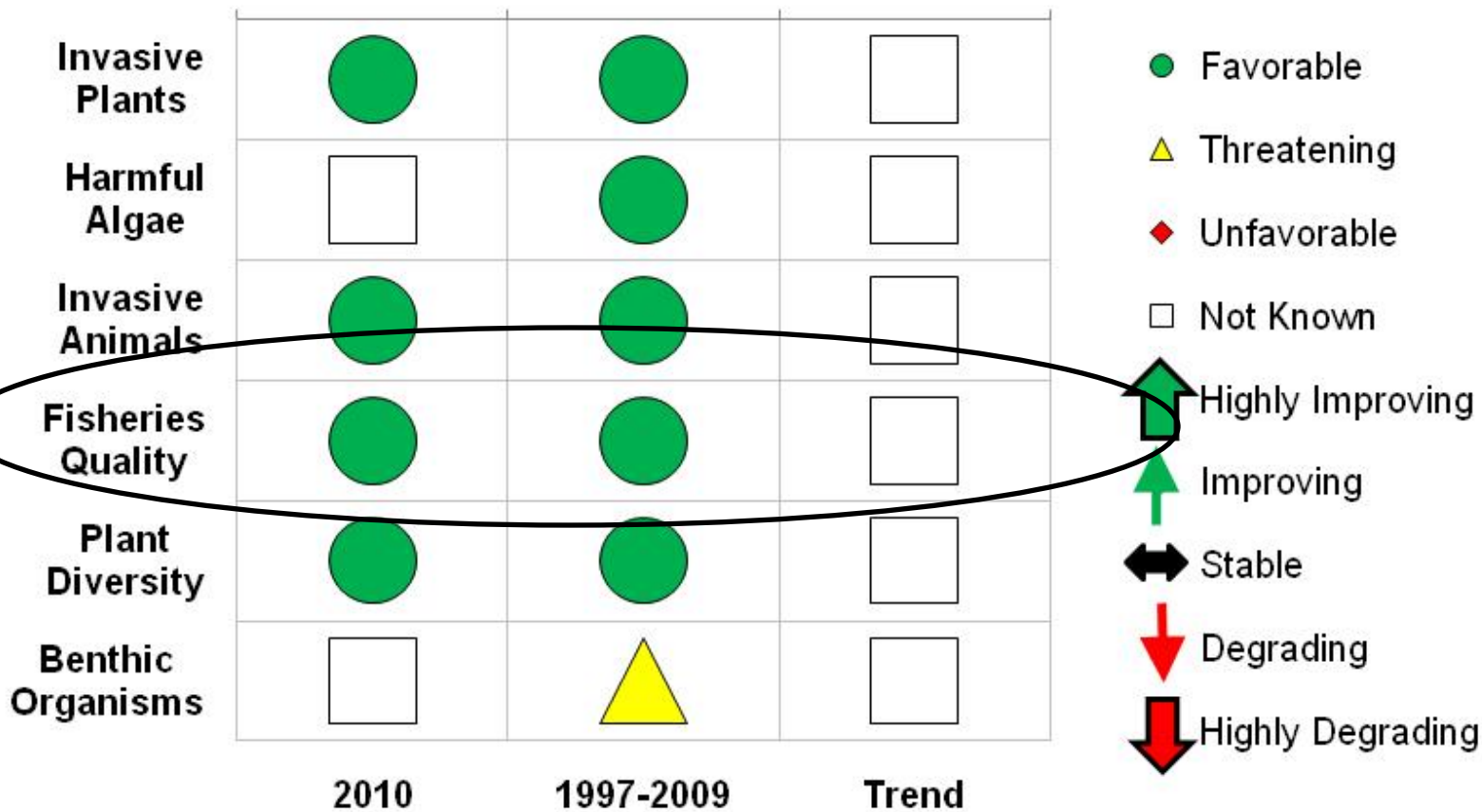


Why Conduct An Angler Survey?

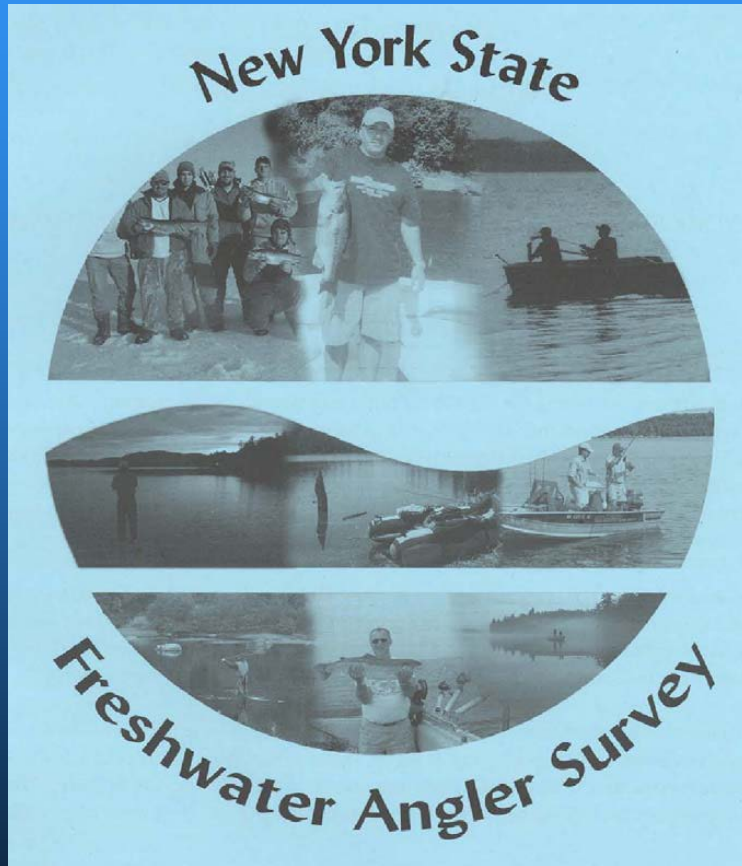
- “to collect information about the fishery from an angler’s perspective” (Diet for a Small Lake, 2nd edition)
- Should include three components:
 - *Angler census*- counts of how many anglers are fishing the lake, the type of fishing (shore, trolling, still), boat size, angler age....
 - *Creel census*- examining daily fish catch (creel or bucket) for fin clips and disease, scale examination for age, and surveying anglers for time spent fishing and equipment used
 - *Angler interviews*- origin of anglers, species caught, evaluation of fisheries and management techniques

Model for CSLAP Angler Surveys



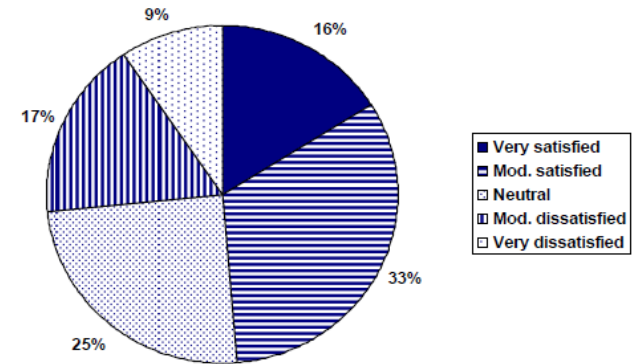
- 2007 New York State Freshwater Angler Survey designed by Cornell
- 20,000 anglers participated (40-50% response rate)
- Conducted by mail solicitation drawn from random draw of state angler license list

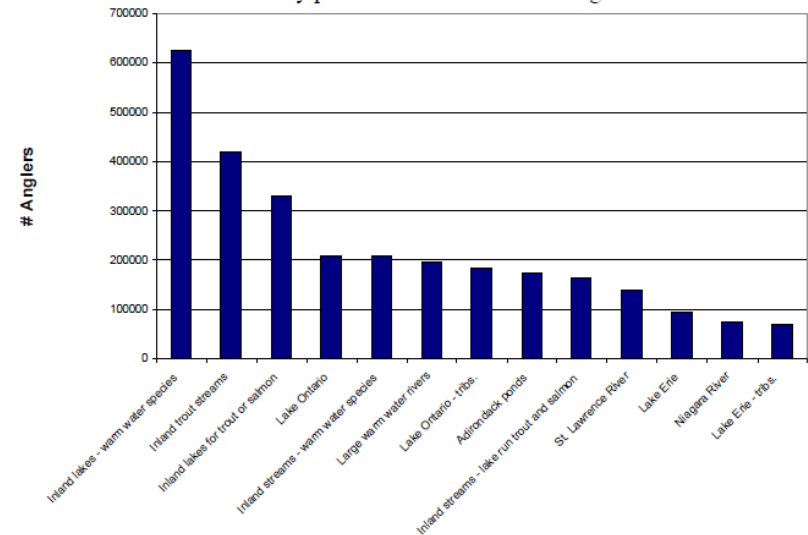
CSLAP Angler Surveys

- Proposed CSLAP Angler Survey focuses on *Angler Interview* component of comprehensive angler survey
- Seeking information on:
 - Fishing patterns- Where, What, How Often?
 - Satisfaction with experience
 - Factors influencing experience
 - Invasives
